Why did the Nonprofit Network Southwest Washington (NNSW) decide to become part of the Greater Vancouver Chamber's Nonprofit POD (Pathways to Opportunity and Development)?

The Nonprofit Network Southwest Washington decided to become part of the Greater Vancouver Chamber's Nonprofit POD to combine, strengthen, and expand the resources to support and advocate for local nonprofit organizations in the region.

What can I expect from this change?

Yes. The Chamber created the Nonprofit POD Program to aid and assist non-profit Staff, Executive Directors, CEOs, and Development Professionals, as well as nonprofit Board members, through workshops, expert assistance, and curated cohorts that discuss relevant topics. The program will provide access to a network of experienced experts and will bring advocacy, training, and civic engagement to our region's nonprofits.

What will the mission be? Will it change?

Both organizations have had a long-standing shared mission to support local nonprofit organizations through education, relationship building, and advocacy, and that will continue after the transition. The Greater Vancouver Chamber will continue with its mission of serving and connecting the nonprofit organizations of the Southwest Washington region with corporate partners and private donors to build supportive networks while decreasing duplication of efforts.





What changes are coming and when?

Effective April 14th, 2023, the Nonprofit Network Southwest Washington's members will become part of the Greater Vancouver Chamber's Nonprofit POD. This will be a thoughtful transition, and the Chamber will carefully assess the best way to coordinate the delivery of services. As the transition plan progresses, we will keep everyone updated.

Will the Nonprofit POD host events?

Yes, the Chamber will continue to host events. The Greater Vancouver Chamber hosts the largest networking events in the region monthly, well attended by members of the nonprofit community.
