

For each pillar, Washingtonians were asked a series of questions asking them to indicate how important it is for them to see different changes in their community. The following charts show key insights related to the vision Washington's economy and top priorities for Clark County residents.

1 Business, Entrepreneurship, and Innovation

How important is it for you to see the following changes to the economy and business environment in your community between now and the year 2040?	Total Important
Invest in industries like manufacturing, technology, and healthcare that create family-wage jobs which help Washington's economy consistently grow	89%
Create enough jobs that allow people to afford to buy a home in their community	89%
Enhance, grow, and increase access to education or training programs that prepare workers for high-skill, high-demand jobs	84%

2 Infrastructure and Connectivity

How important is it for you to see the following infrastructure changes in your community between now and the year 2040?	Total Important
Ensure Washington has adequate water supply for residential, agricultural, and industrial needs	94%
Ensure that high speed internet access and cell phone connectivity is available in all communities	87%
Build enough affordable housing to support a growing workforce	81%

3 Talent

How important is it for you to see the following changes to public education in your community between now and the year 2040?	Total Important
Expose teens to more career paths, including through work experience before high school graduation	93%
Increase the number of students who graduate from college, trade school, an apprenticeship, or some other professional credential program	86%
Prioritize education funding for high-skill, high-demand jobs (i.e., nursing, cyber security, trades, etc.)	85%

4 Place and Community
